

COMMUNITY CAFÉ

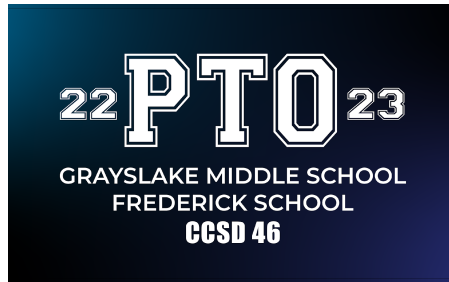

Self-Regulation and Resilience: Supporting Our Children In Their Hardest Moments

Although theories of motivation to explain challenging behaviors were largely disproved decades ago, we still cling to incentives and punishments to manage our children's behavior. Unfortunately, while these strategies may work in the short run (or not), they can create long-term problems for children and their parents. This workshop will explore the limits and impacts of using incentives and punishments and provide strategies to help children learn to self-regulate during their hardest moments.

Aunque las teorías de la motivación para explicar los comportamientos desafiantes fueron refutadas en gran medida hace décadas, todavía nos aferramos a los incentivos y castigos para controlar el comportamiento de nuestros hijos. Desafortunadamente, si bien estas estrategias pueden funcionar a corto plazo (o no), pueden crear problemas a largo plazo para los niños y sus padres. Este taller explorará los límites y los impactos del uso de incentivos y castigos y proporcionará estrategias para ayudar a los niños a aprender a autorregularse durante sus momentos más difíciles.

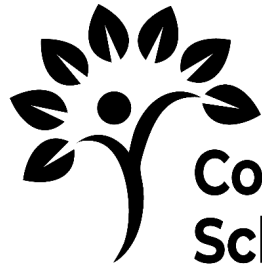

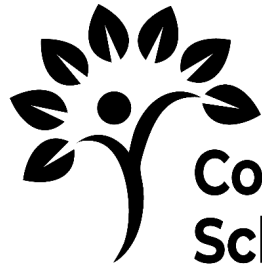
The district technology department hopes that your family is having a good school year and that the technology provided to all students is proving to be beneficial. Unfortunately, we have seen a large increase in the amount of damage to students' chromebooks compared to previous school years. Although accidents certainly happen, much of what we are seeing is due to carelessness, such as carrying the Chromebook by the screen rather than closing it. We are also seeing a lot of keys being purposely removed from the keyboards.

In an effort to curb this trend, we are asking for your help. Please talk to your children about the importance of caring for expensive equipment owned by the school district. For our part, we are investing in protective cases for all student chromebooks. These cases are designed to remain on the Chromebook at all times. In addition, we will return to the practice of assessing fees for the damage caused by neglect and/or misconduct once the new cases are distributed.

- Chromebook Replacement - \$300.00
- Power cord - \$35.00
- Screen - \$100.00
- Missing keys - \$25 total cost per repair

If a fee is assessed, you will receive an email informing you of this. Your school's principal will answer any questions you may have at that time.

El departamento de tecnología del distrito espera que su familia esté teniendo un buen año escolar y que la tecnología proporcionada a todos los estudiantes esté demostrando ser beneficiosa. Desafortunadamente, hemos visto un gran aumento en la cantidad de daños a los Chromebooks de los estudiantes en comparación con años escolares anteriores. Aunque los accidentes ocurren sin duda, gran parte de lo que estamos viendo se debe a un descuido, como llevar el Chromebook por la pantalla en lugar de cerrarla. También estamos viendo muchas teclas arrancadas a propósito de los teclados.
