Student Council Rec Nights - 6th Grade TONIGHT & 5th Grade is NEXT WEEK!

Rec Nights are a popular drop-off event for our students that includes an evening of fun at school with a DJ and an open gym - all provided with \$5.00 admission! There are also concessions, raffle tickets for prizes, and a few extra games available for additional purchase. The dates for the first Rec Nights are as follows:

TONIGHT: 6th Grade Rec Night 6:30 - 8:30pm
Friday, November 1st: 5th Grade Rec Night - 6:30 - 8:30pm

Please note that these events are open **ONLY** to Frederick students in the designated grade level. These events have always been very popular as our students are given the opportunity to connect with each other for an evening of fun in a supervised environment.

Cell phones will **NOT** be allowed at Rec Nights. All students are encouraged to leave their cell phones at home. If a student does bring his/her phone to the event, they will be required to check their phone for safekeeping and it will be returned at the end of the night. If for some reason they need to contact a parent during the event, they can use the school phones or they can use their cell phone with supervision from an adult. We started this practice a few years ago and found it really encouraged students to have a fun evening free from devices and eliminated many issues related to social media.

Rec Night Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: Who supervises this event?

A: Supervision will be provided by Frederick staff and other volunteers including parents of student council members. All areas that are accessible to students will be supervised. Students **MUST** follow all school expectations, and if this is an issue a student may be required to leave the event early.

Q: How much money does a student need?

A: All students will need to pay the admission cost, which is \$5.00. We would appreciate it if students could bring a five dollar bill or singles instead of larger bills that can be difficult to make change. Additional items will be available for purchase which include raffle tickets, concessions (pizza, nachos, candy, drinks), and extra games for prizes that range (like ring toss) from an additional \$1.00 - \$2.00. Typically, we have seen most students will spend an additional \$5 - \$15 dollars on these items or activities.

Q: Help! My child thinks they need to “ask” someone to go with them?

A: In the past, some students have been under the impression that they need to ask someone, like a date. This is **NOT** the case! In fact, we discourage this practice and just want our students to be able to have some fun with their classmates!

Q: How does pick-up work?

A: Rec Night will end at 8:30pm. We ask that all students are picked up promptly. Because we anticipate large crowds, please use both the main parking lot and small circle drive. It will be helpful for you to talk about pickup arrangements ahead of time as it will be pretty dark, and your child can expect where to find their ride.

Carpooling when possible will also be a great way to help traffic flow much more smoothly!



Halloween - Thursday, October 31st

Halloween is coming! Frederick students are allowed to wear costumes, but we do not have specific Halloween celebrations or class parties like those that have occurred in the elementary buildings. Our school promotes a respectful and inclusive environment, so please take a moment to review our guidelines regarding costumes at school.

Costumes should be comfortable and conducive to learning. When helping your child choose a costume, please remember that weapons and other suggestions of overt violence (i.e. blood and/or gore) are **NOT** allowed. To help support a respectful environment, we kindly ask that students refrain from wearing costumes that appropriate or stereotype cultures, as this can perpetuate harmful stereotypes or misunderstandings. It is also important to take into consideration that some families are deeply offended by the representation of witches, ghosts, vampires, devils, werewolves, and goblins. Please be courteous when assisting your child in choosing a costume.

Costumes must also abide by the "Student Dress" expectations described in the student handbook. School staff also reserves the right to remove disruptive costumes or portions thereof. Please keep in mind that some costumes (i.e. inflatables or large costumes) may not be suitable for school due to space and movement limitations (i.e., sitting at desks and tables, bus seats, participating in P.E.)

Halloween is taking place during our annual Red Ribbon Spirit Week, so we are looking forward to a week filled with different fun themes. Thank you very much for all your support and understanding!

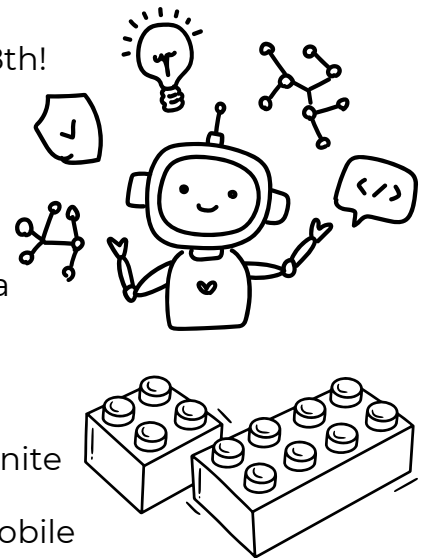

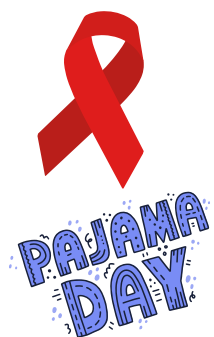

Fall 2024 Parent/Teacher Conferences

Fall parent/teacher conferences are coming soon! Conferences will be held on Monday, November 25th and Tuesday, November 26th. In effort to provide options to our families, there will be designated times for in-person and virtual conferences (via Google Meet) as shown below.

Teachers will be reaching out next week to begin scheduling conferences. Please note that in order to be able to offer flexibility in scheduling options, there will be differences in how each type of conference is facilitated.

Virtual conferences will be held with your child's homeroom teacher, who will provide updates for all core academic classes. For in-person conferences, our teachers will use a team model that will allow each of your child's core academic teachers to check-in and provide an update on your child's progress in each class. Both types of conferences will be scheduled for 15 minutes.

We know that the differences in conference experiences is not ideal, but there are logistical issues that prevent our staff from being able to implement the team model in a virtual setting. **We encourage all parents/guardians who are able to attend conferences onsite to select the in-person option**, but we are pleased to be able to offer the virtual option for families who are not able to attend.

P.E./Health, Encore, and Band teachers will be reaching out to families the week of November 11th to offer opportunities to sign up for conferences.

Erin's Law Presentations

Erin's Law, House Bill 6193, was signed by Governor Pat Quinn on January 24, 2013. This law requires schools to implement an age-appropriate sexual assault and abuse awareness and prevention curriculum for grades pre-K through 12.

We are very pleased to share that Childhood Victories will be assisting our schools with the curriculum entitled *Be Seen and Heard*®, a prevention-oriented child sexual abuse program. This curriculum is developmentally appropriate, interactive, and aligned with the learning standards associated with the law. The focus of the presentation is to teach students basic skills to keep them safe from dangerous or abusive situations. On Tuesday, October 22nd, there was a parent presentation outlining the presentation students will receive. The concepts that will be discussed with students are:

- Distinguishing safe from unsafe touches
- Safety rules at home and school
- Saying "NO"
- Safe/Unsafe Secrets
- It's not a child's fault if someone touches him or her
- Telling a trusted adult

Childhood Victories will be presenting at our schools through online videos that CCSD 46 staff will facilitate. At grades K-4 these presentations will be completed by the PE teacher and social worker during the weeks of January 13 and 20. At grades 5-8, these presentations will be completed during the students 3rd rotation of health by the health teacher and social worker.

Dear Frederick Families,

Last week students and staff at Frederick School reviewed our ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) procedures and what to do in the presence of an active threat to our safety. Students also practiced visiting our rallying point, which is a safe location off campus that students should get to in the event of an emergency evacuation.

On Wednesday, November 6th, we will have officers from the Grayslake Police Department on site as we run our annual mandated law enforcement safety drill, which will include practicing a lockdown.

In compliance with the Safety Drill Act, families have the right to exempt their child from participation in the law enforcement drill with their peers. If you do not wish for your child, please contact James Goschy at goschy.james@d46.org and the Frederick administration will arrange for your child to work quietly in another space during the drill and provide an alternative review of our safety procedures in the event of an armed intruder.

CCSD 46 is an ALICE district and information for our families regarding ALICE can be found on our district [website](#). ALICE is a trauma-informed practice, which means that our staff will be very attentive to student needs throughout training and our drill. We do believe that informed students are empowered students, and hope that all of our students will be able to participate in ALICE training.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Last spring, students in grades 5 & 8 participated in the Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) exam. The ISA aligns with our [Illinois Learning Standards](#) in science. This assessment helps families understand how well students are performing academically. The ISA represents Illinois' commitment to preparing all students for college and careers, including in the high-demand science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. The assessment also satisfies federal accountability requirements.

If you had a child in D46 last year in grade 5, you are being provided a copy of their individual ISA student reports. There are separate reports for English Language Arts and math.

ISBE has also introduced the [Illinois Parent Portal](#), where parents/guardians can learn about their children's performance on the ISA. The [Parent Portal User Guide](#) has information on how to create an account, log in to the account, and add claim codes to access student score reports and video of Individual Student Reports (ISRs). In addition to paper reports you received, video versions are also available via the Parent Portal. The video score report communicates information from the ISR through animations and a voiceover in Illinois' seven most common languages: English, Spanish, Polish, Arabic, French, Urdu, and Gujarati.

We know that state assessment results are important external data points regarding your child's achievement, but they may not provide a complete picture of your child. The additional data provided by your classroom teacher regarding your child's day-to-day performance during conferences and report cards throughout the year are significantly more important. We welcome the opportunity to continue to discuss the social and academic growth your child is making. Please contact your child's teacher, the building principal or the district office if you have any additional questions.
