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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Frederick Families,

We hope that everyone had a wonderful week! As a reminder, your child's report card should now be accessible in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. For our 5th graders, we know this is the first time students are receiving letter grades and one of our goals is to help all students develop a sense of personal responsibility and ownership of their learning at school. We hope that all of our students are proud of their grades and their efforts, but if your child did not earn the grades they were hoping for, there are always chances to keep growing and improving this trimester!

Helping students develop responsibility over their schoolwork is a crucial aspect of their academic and personal growth. Here are a few things you can do at home to help foster this sense of responsibility:

Establish a Routine: Set a consistent daily routine for homework and study time. Having a designated time and place for studying helps create a habit.

Create a Study-friendly Environment: Ensure that the study area is well-lit, quiet, and free from distractions. This helps children focus on their work.

Reward Effort and Persistence: Acknowledge and celebrate your child's efforts and persistence, rather than focusing solely on grades. This helps build a positive attitude toward learning!

Encourage Them to Check Their Progress Regularly: Did you know students have access to the Student Portal on Infinite Campus? They can review their current progress and missing assignments at any time!

Encourage a Growth Mindset: Emphasize the importance of learning and growth rather than just achieving high grades. A growth mindset fosters resilience and a willingness to take on challenges.

Celebrate Achievements: When your child meets their goals or shows improvement, celebrate their achievements. Positive reinforcement reinforces responsible behavior.

Building responsibility is a gradual process that will continue throughout adolescence, and every child is unique. It may not always look the same for each family and that is okay! As parents, you know your child best!

Next week, our teachers are looking forward to conferences and the opportunity to discuss your child's progress with you. We will have an early dismissal on Tuesday and then no school for the rest of the week.

There will not be a newsletter sent next week on account of Thanksgiving. There are many things I am thankful for, and among them is the honor to work with the wonderful students, families, and staff members of the Frederick School each and every day. I wish you all a safe and wonderful holiday!


Winter NWEA MAP Testing: December 4th & 5th

All Frederick students will be taking the Winter NWEA MAP assessments on Wednesday, December 4th and Thursday, December 5th. MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) is a computerized adaptive assessment that measures your child's knowledge of reading and math. All students are asked the same number of questions, but the difficulty of each question is based on how well a student answers all the previous questions. As the student answers correctly, questions become more difficult. If the student answers incorrectly, the questions become easier and then become progressively more challenging. This enables the assessment to precisely identify the full spectrum of a student's strengths and areas of growth.

MAP assessments are used to measure student progress and growth in reading and math. These assessments will help teachers understand your child's areas of strength and weakness and provide appropriate instruction.

Important Reminders for Cold Weather

We knew colder weather would come eventually, and this week it certainly hit us! Winter weather has arrived and will be around for awhile! While we recognize that students all have different preferences when it comes to choosing what to wear each day, we encourage all students to dress in a way that will keep them comfortable given the weather.



Recess

We will plan to hold recess outdoors each day (weather permitting) if the temperature is above 40 degrees. When temperatures are below 40 degrees, we provide students an option between outdoor and indoor recess activities. If the temperature drops to where the "real feel" is below 10 degrees, all recess activities will be indoors only.

When fields are covered in snow, students will only be able to play in snow covered fields when they are wearing appropriate winter gear (at minimum this must include a coat, snow pants, and boots.) While we want our students to be able to enjoy the snow, we also want to make sure that they are comfortable and dry upon returning to class.

Ground conditions may also impact our offering of outdoor activities. When our fields are too wet and muddy, outdoor options may be limited to blacktop only. Because the blacktop areas can become quite overcrowded, we have adjusted to offering indoor activities for interested students to balance out the size of the groups in these limited outdoor spaces.

Morning Arrival

Please also remember that unless a student is attending a before school activity (could include choir, band, or student council meetings), our doors will **NOT** open to students until 8:30am. It is for this reason that we ask parents who drop off to plan to be at school as close to 8:30am as possible. Students who arrive early will need to wait outside until our doors are opened as we do not have supervision in place prior to 8:30am. During the winter, please make sure your child is dressed warmly if they will be waiting outside before the doors are opened.





Chromebook Care

Chromebooks are a vital tool that all students at Frederick use daily. It provides our students important access to resources, programs and class assignments.



It is part of our daily expectations that students bring their chromebook to and from school daily and to make sure the chromebook is fully charged each day.

It is also important to remember that students are responsible for their devices at all times. In recent weeks, we have seen an increase in damages that have been reported to our tech office.

To lessen the risk of damage and associated costly repairs, students should practice good etiquette by making sure to:

- Never carry the chromebook with screen open
- Never attempting to remove the district issued case
- Avoid eating or drinking near the chromebook
- Never attempt to pry off any keys
- Hold the chromebook securely in both hands while moving

REMEMBER

Please report any issues with your chromebook to your child's teacher as soon as possible.

Please **DO NOT** attempt any repairs yourself or have the device serviced by an outside computer service.

- Cold weather gear- hats, gloves, scarves


