Morning Drop-Off and Afternoon Pick-Up: Reminders for Car Riders

The cold and wintery weather has often caused an increase in the number of students who are car riders on any given day, so we wanted to share these reminders with everyone. We strive to make the drop-off and pick-up process as efficient and safe as possible, we kindly request your cooperation in pulling as far forward as you can when arriving at Frederick School.


This helps to alleviate traffic congestion and also ensures a smoother and quicker experience for everyone involved by allowing more students to enter or exit vehicles simultaneously.


Morning drop-off will always utilize the small circle drive just outside the Frederick main office. Students should exit the passenger side of the vehicle anywhere along the curb. Please remember that our doors will not open until 8:30am so we suggest arriving as close to then as possible. If you are a few minutes early, students should be dropped off to wait outside as the circle drive must not be used for idling cars as we need to keep it moving to prevent backups that cause significant congestion on Frederick Rd.

For afternoon pick-up, all parents must line up around the perimeter of the large parking lot. Students will be waiting along the sidewalk. Once your child has entered your vehicle, please move into the left lane to proceed to the parking lot exit. For safety reasons, students should not walk beyond the sidewalk into the parking lot to enter a vehicle. Please remember that the small circle drive outside of the main office is for small buses, daycare vans, and taxis only during dismissal.

Your cooperation is greatly appreciated, and we thank you for your ongoing support in making arrival and dismissal procedures for our car riders as efficient as possible!







<u>Erin's Law</u>

Erin's Law, House Bill 6193, was signed by Governor Pat Quinn on January 24, 2013. This law requires schools to implement an age-appropriate sexual assault and abuse awareness and prevention curriculum for grades pre-K through 12.

We are very pleased to share that Childhood Victories will be assisting our schools with the curriculum entitled *Be Seen and Heard*©, a prevention-oriented child sexual abuse program. This curriculum is developmentally appropriate, interactive, and aligned with the learning standards associated with the law.

The focus of the presentation is to teach students basic skills to keep them safe from dangerous or abusive situations. On Tuesday, October 22nd, there was a parent presentation outlining the presentation students will receive. The concepts that will be discussed are:

- Distinguishing safe from unsafe touches
- Safety rules at home and school
- Saying "NO"
- Safe/Unsafe Secrets
- It's not the child's fault if someone touches him or her.
- Telling a trusted adult
- To learn more about this curriculum, go to **www.PeaceofMindVideos.com**. The video of Been Seen and Heard Year 1 Peace of Mind video covers exactly the same information that was shared during the parent information night.

Childhood Victories will be presenting at our schools through online videos that CCSD 46 staff will facilitate. At grades K-4 these presentations will be completed by the PE teacher and social worker during the weeks of January 13 and 20.

At grades 5-8, these presentations will be completed during the students' 3rd rotation of health by the health teacher and social worker. The third and final rotation for Health at Frederick will begin on February 28th and continue for each group throughout the 3rd trimester.

Thursday, January 23 6:00PM - 8:30PM Just For Fun Roller Rink, Mundelein


