Dear Frederick Families,

February is now upon us, which means that one of our BEST celebrations of the year is coming soon - Frederick's Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) Week! This year we are celebrating during the week of February 10th and included with this newsletter you will see our spirit days as well as some other information for our families.

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As children progress through the middle grades and develop independence, they also face a few new pressures like increased responsibility, evolving friendships, and a desire to fit in. Sometimes this makes recognizing the power of kindness a little trickier! Encouraging kindness in adolescents involves a combination of positive role modeling, open communication, and age-appropriate activities. While it is a big focus here at school, here are some strategies parents can use at home:

1. **Model Kindness:** Demonstrate kindness in your own interactions with others. Children often look to their parents as role models, so consistently modeling kind behavior is powerful.

2. **Encourage Empathy:** Help your child develop empathy by discussing different perspectives and feelings. Encourage them to consider how their actions might impact others or to consider the feelings of others.

3. **Teach Conflict Resolution:** Provide guidance on resolving conflicts peacefully. Teach communication skills, active listening, and problem-solving strategies to help your child navigate disagreements with kindness and understanding.

4. **Set Expectations:** Clearly communicate your expectations for kind behavior. Discuss the importance of treating others with respect and kindness in all settings. Reinforce positive behaviors with praise and acknowledgment.

5. **Promote Inclusivity:** Encourage your child to be inclusive and reach out to peers who may feel left out. Discuss the value of diversity and the importance of accepting and embracing differences.

6. **Discuss Online Behavior:** Talk about the importance of kindness in online interactions. Remind your child about the potential impact of their words and actions on social media. Encourage positive online behavior and responsible use of technology.

7. **Celebrate Kindness at Home:** Acknowledge and celebrate acts of kindness within your family! This helps foster a positive and supportive environment that reinforces the values of empathy, compassion, and consideration.

Registration for the 2025-2026 School Year is Now OPEN!

We are excited to announce that Online Registration for the 2025-2026 school year is now open! CCSD 46 offers a \$25 Early Bird discount for families that complete the online application and submit payment before June 3rd, the last day of school.

Please remember that for registration to be complete for the upcoming school year the Online Registration application must be submitted with necessary supporting documents and payment or a payment plan must be received. Schedules and transportation assignments will not be released in August until registration is complete.

Pre-K students must complete the Early Childhood Screening and qualify for one of the early childhood programs PRIOR to completing the registration application. For more information regarding the Early Childhood program, please contact Sue Hobson at (847) 543-6204.

Returning Family Registration

If a child in your family has currently or previously been enrolled in CCSD 46, you can access registration through your Infinite Campus <u>parent portal</u>. If you do not have an account or have forgotten your password, please contact your child's school.

Online registration is completed as a family. If you are enrolling new students from your family or your student is moving buildings, they are still considered continuing students and all students in the family are completed through the same application.

If you have never had a student enrolled in a CCSD 46 school, you will complete a <u>New Family</u> <u>Registration</u> form.

Tips for Cleaning & Caring for Your Student Chromebook

As Chromebooks are an essential part of our students' learning experience, it's important to charge them every night and keep them in good condition. Proper care and regular cleaning help ensure these devices remain functional and last throughout the school year. Below are some helpful tips for maintaining your student's Chromebook.

Cleaning Your Chromebook

Turn It Off First

Before cleaning, ensure the Chromebook is powered off and unplugged from any charger.

Use a Microfiber Cloth

To clean the screen and exterior, use a soft, lint free microfiber cloth. This prevents scratches and removes dust or smudges effectively.

Avoid Harsh Cleaners

Do not use bleach, ammonia-based cleaners, or abrasive materials. For tougher spots, lightly dampen the cloth with water or a solution of 70% isopropyl alcohol and gently wipe the surface.

Caring for Your Chromebook

Keep It in Its Case

Always store the Chromebook in its provided protective case when not in use. This helps prevent accidental drops, scratches, and other damage.

Avoid Overloading the Screen

Do not place items like pens, papers, or chargers on the keyboard before closing the Chromebook. This is a common cause of screen damage.

Charge It Regularly and Safely

Chromebooks should be charged every night to ensure they are ready for learning. Plug and unplug the charger carefully, and avoid bending or twisting the charging cable. Always charge the Chromebook on a flat, stable surface.

Store It Properly

When not in use, store the Chromebook in a secure, dry location away from food, drinks, and extreme temperatures.

Report Issues Promptly

If your student notices a problem with their Chromebook, encourage them to report it to their teacher immediately to prevent further damage.

Keeping Our School Community Healthy: A Note from Our Health Office

As we move through the winter months, we wanted to all families to be aware that we have noticed an increase in seasonal illnesses. Please be vigilant for any signs or symptoms of illness in your child. If your child is showing symptoms that could be contagious, we kindly ask that you keep them at home to rest and recover. If your child receives a diagnosis from a healthcare provider, please inform us as soon as possible.

Additionally, parents and guardians are asked to notify the attendance line at (847) 223-3540, option 4, option 6, by 8:00 AM. This is a 24-hour line, so you can call at any time.

As a reminder, <u>your child may not attend school or any school based activities</u> if your child has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, unexplained rash or red eyes the night before or the morning of school.

Diarrhea is defined as 3 loose stools in 24 hours or a change in bowel habit. A fever is defined as a temperature of 100.4°F. Most fevers subside in the morning, but go up again during the day. Your child can return to school when your child has been symptom free for 24 hours without the aid of a fever reducing medication.




